CC116 Florida Orange	Mayco Stoneware Coupe Plate
CC123 Sunflowers	Earthenware 8x8" Tile
CC112 Candy Apple Red	(greenware or soft fired to 010)
CC150 Light Cerulean Blue	WS Wire Loop or
CC151 Cerulean	L3 Diamond Core Tool
CC152 Deep Cerulean	
CC160 Key Lime	Mr. Marks' Wax ON wax resist
CC161 Green Leaf	
CC162 Laurel Green	
LE003 Aqua Splash	
PIPKIT4 1 oz. Piping Kit	

Glazes:

CSP01 Gloss Medium NT Clear—Earthenware
Mayco SW-004 Zinc Free Clear—Cone 5/6

Brushes:

Small & Medium Sumi
#8 Fan Glaze Brush

This project can be done on greenware or bisque and on earthenware or stoneware.

1. Trace pattern on with tissue and watercolor marker if on earthenware bisque. Ultra fine point sharpie if on stoneware bisque or top of a glaze for majolica.
2. If you are working on stoneware bisque, applying the design and color, you will brush on 2 coats of Mayco SW-004 Zinc Free Clear glaze over the color when done.

If working on earthenware you will apply 2 coats of CFE CSP01 Gloss Medium NT Clear over your colors with a fan brush.

3. Put Wax resist in piping bottle and using the black bent tip, trace over the pattern. Allow wax to dry.
4. Flowers: CC150 Light Cerulean, CC151 Cerulean and CC152 Deep Cerulean.
5. Leaves: CC123 Sunflowers, CC160 Key Lime, CC161 Green Leaf and CC162 Laurel Green. You can leave the yellow off of some of them.
6. Flower Centers: CC123 Sunflowers, CC116 Florida Orange and a little bit of CC160 Key Lime.
7. Background: Start with CC123 Sunflowers then CC116 Florida Orange, LE003 Aqua Splash and CC112 Candy Apple Red.



8. Fire to 04 to burn off the wax resist.
9. Apply clear glaze and fire to the temperature that matches your clay body and glaze.





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
