

Ultra White Gloss Glaze CGE502

Ultra White Gloss Glaze is an **Opaque** white gloss glaze. Decorate on top of Ultra White with Color Concentrates for a Majolica technique and apply 1 coat of CG900 Crystal Clear for a finishing touch. It can be tinted for an opaque colored gloss glaze and can also be used for a textured technique like the Tumbled Marble look and much more. Ultra White is a **Non-Toxic** and **Food Safe** non-moving Gloss Glaze. Available in 4-oz., pints and gallons.



- Majolica 1. 3 coats CGE502 Ultra White Gloss Glaze.
- Conditioned Color Concentrates with CSP01 Gloss Medium applied on top of for design.
- 1 coat of CG900 Crystal Clear over entire surface.

If Clear is not applied over the top you will have some movement in color. <u>Color Concentrates</u> CC151 Cerulean Blue CC163 Shadow Green

Opaque Colored Gloss Glaze

- Mix 2 parts CGE502 Ultra White Gloss Glaze with 1/2 part CC163 Shadow Green. Amount of color concentrate will determine end color.
- 2. Apply 3 coats for an opaque colored gloss glaze.

Keep in mind that whatever color you mix with the CGE502 it will be a pastel colored gloss glaze.

- Tumbled Marble Look 1. 2 coats of CGE502 Ultra White Gloss Glaze.
- 50/50 mix of CGE502 and CSP20 Terra Firma sponged on 2 coats.
- Washes of CSP01 Gloss Medium with Color Concentrates 50/50 mix with wet fan brush.
- Blend 1 part CGE502 to 2 parts water and apply a wash over entire surface to give a polished satin look.
