

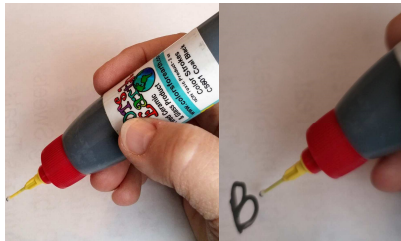
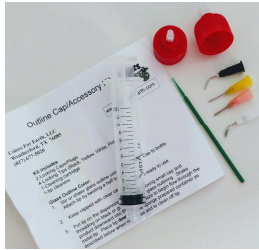
CHRISTMAS PLAID

This Technique is done on o4 bisque.

Stripes—With large square shader make Vertical stripes with 2 coats of **CS655 Ocean Blue Green**. With medium square shader make Horizontal stripes with 2 coats of **CS631 Rose Madder**.

Holly—With pencil sketch on holly leaves and berries. With medium square shader block in with 2 coats of **CS661 Leaf Green**. Shade the outside of each leaf with **CS665 Forest Green**.

Holly Berries—Using a detail brush, apply 1 coat of **CS632 Crimson** on all holly berries. Or, you can use our "Outline Cap/Accessory kit" and remove the flip top cap from your 2 oz. bottle and replace with the red cap and add the black bent tip to draw and flood on the color for the berries.



Allow project to completely dry.

Using the cap/tip accessory on your **CS632 Crimson** and the black bent tip make the wavy burgundy lines both horizontal and vertically.

NOTE: When using the tip to do line work over your dried color try to go one direction to avoid scratching off color and clogging your tip.

Using the cap/tip on your **CS601 Coal Black** and the black bent tip outline and detail the holly leaves and berries.

With Fan glaze brush apply 2 coats of **CSP01 Gloss Medium** brushing glaze. Still and fire to witness cone 06.

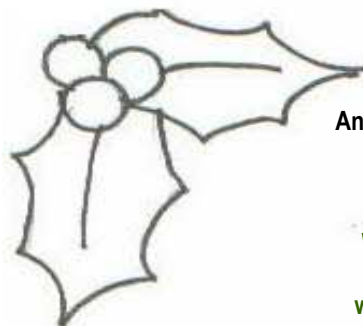
Color Strokes: Color is applied to bisque, by brushing, sponge, stamping, finger painting, flood tip or fine line tip. Product should be shaken well before any application. Firing range cone 6 through 06.

Apply to bisque:

- **Brushing** – Using a brush, 1 coat is transparent, 3 coats results in solid coverage. Shake well and squeeze out onto a tile for brush application.
- **Stamping**— With rubber, foam or sponge stamps.
- **Flooding Color with Black Tip**—Perfect for outline of patterns, and flooding in pattern areas for solid coverage.
- **Majolica**—Use over a raw Satin Non-Flowing Glaze then follow with a thin coat of Clear Glaze and fire to 06.
- **Fine Line Writing**—Use black blue tip for fine line writing with Color Strokes.

Piping Kit—has a tip cleaner and is required to keep tips clean and working properly.

Details—This hybrid color is lightly fritted. Clear Glaze should be applied on top of solid coverage or design work before firing.
